

- 1. Click the main menu item 'Walking'.
- 2. Click on the sub menu option 'Walking in the Chilterns'.
- 3. This displays a map of the Chilterns with walks and lunch venues numbered in different colours.
- 4. The map can be zoomed and paned in the usual way.





1. Clicking on the button in the top left of the map hides or shows the legend (see next page).



 Clicking on the button in the bottom left of the map toggles the base map style between satellite imagery and base map (see next page).



 Clicking on the lunch venue button or the lunch venue in the legend, displays the details for the venue (see next page).



- 1. If available, you can click on the link to the venue's website.
- 2. Clicking on the direction arrow will launch Google maps with the venue as your destination.



 Clicking on the walk button or the walk in the legend, displays the details for the walk (see next page).



- 1. The length, ascent and number of stiles are given for the walk.
- 2. Details for the start of the walk including the OS grid reference, latitude and longitude, post code (approximate location) and the What3Words reference as a clickable link.
- Clicking on the direction arrow will launch Google maps with the start of the walk as your destination, enabling you to get directions to the start of the walk.
- 4. Clicking on the link to the walk details and map, will open another tab with the pdf of the walk (see next page).

The counterclockwise circular walk starts in the Longborough Hall car park (no charge), adjacent to the cemetary off Park Lane, in the village of Stokenchurch.

The cemetery of St Peter's and St Paul's contains ten CWGC graves, two from the first World War and eight from the Second. Two of those from the Second World War are women. Florence Steptce of the Auxillary Territorial Service was killed in a vehicle accident between Brechin and Arbroath.

Eleanor Slade of the Air Transport Auxillary was killed in a crash at Little Rissington on the 13th of July 1944 while flying Wellington Z1690.



The village War Memorial and Grade II listed Memorial Hall were built in 1925 on land donated by Marcus Slade Q.C., Eleanor's father.

Details of the route and the starting point are given, along with a description and a map of the route.

The start is circled in red on the map.
